2. Environmental Clearance Of Ispat Sukinda Chromite Mines (MI Area 35.6 Ha) Of M/S. Balasore Alloys Ltd At Village Kaliapani, Tahasil Sukinda, Dist – Jajpur For Production Of Chromite Ore Of Capacity 0.4 Mtpa Through Underground Mining Methods (EC).

Earlier the proposal was placed in the meeting of SEAC held on 29th May, 2015 and the SEAC had recommended for grant of Environmental Clearance for a period of 30 years. The proposal was again placed in the 132nd meeting of SEIAA held on 15.07.2015, and the Authority considered the proposal & opined that chromite mining & beneficiation process release Cr⁺⁶ to the underground water which consequently through seepage, discharges carcinogenic Cr⁺⁶ to the nearby water sources which is a great concern for environmental pollution & health of the people living around and using nearby water sources. On the said matter, Hon'ble High Court of Odisha through its Registrar have taken up the issue in WP(C) No. 6976/2014 which is still subjudice. Hence the Authority decided the proposal to be returned to the SEAC for thorough re-examination of the proposal looking into discharge of Cr⁺⁶ in particular.

The matter was again discussed by the SEAC in its meeting held on 10.08.2015 and opined that the project proponent will carry out underground mining activity and the ore body is lumpy in nature. Occurrence of Cr⁺⁶ in mine drainage water of such ore body has not been encountered in Odisha. Being aware of the fact, as a precautionary measure, the SEAC while recommending the proposal in its meeting held on 29th May 2015 for grant of environmental clearance the following condition has already been recommended to be stipulated in the environmental clearance. The mine drainage water if will be found containing Cr⁺⁶ shall be treated in a dedicated new ETP of adequate capacity. The sludge from the ETP will be disposed as Hazardous waste. In order to maintain zero discharge, the mine shall store the mine drainage water, treated water in a reservoir and prior to the construction of the reservoir necessary. Geophysical study may be done for its impact on the UG mining. The water requirement shall be met from the stored treated water. The mine drainage water shall be used for stowing and make up water of beneficiation plant located in the adjacent mine. In view of the above, the committee reiterate its earlier stand and without prejudice to the court case pending, recommended for grant of environmental clearance.

The proposal was then placed in SEIAA meeting held on 14.08.2015 and the Authority had deferred the proposal for the next committee.

3. File No. 109-46/EPE dated 20.10.2015 received from Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Govt. of India, Eastern Regional Office, Chandrasekharpur, Bhubaneswar regarding compliance status of M/s Z Estate Pvt. Ltd.

Present Status of Proposal: The SEAC had recommended to amend the Environmental Clearance as per the revised proposal in its meeting held on 30th March, 2015.

The proposal was put up in the meeting of SEIAA held on 08.05.2015. As this was an expansion project, as per circular No.J-11011/618/2010-IA.II(I) dt. 30.05.2012, the committee decided that EC can only be considered after proper compliance of the observations made by Eastern Regional Office, MoEF & CC. The Compliance status submitted by the project with their review and comments of Director of Regional Office of MoEF & CC was forwarded to SEIAA vide File No-109-46/EPE dt. 13.07.2015. The proposal was placed for discussion in SEIAA's meeting held on 13.08.2015 and the committee decided that the Regional Office of MoEF & CC may be requested to clarify the last point under Point No-3 in other observation "The project has constructed a Club House without environmental Clearance. It is a serious violation of EIA Notification, 2006 ". Further, vide your letter no File No-109-46/EPE dt. 13.07.2015 in point No-2 in Annexure-1 may be clarified whether it will be treated as a violation of EC Condition or not.

The Regional Office of MoEF & CC vide File No-109-46/EPE dt. 20.10.2015 has submitted their reply to the clarification sought by SEIAA vide letter no.4704/SEIAA dt.17.08.2015.
